**RESOLUTION NO. 95 – 2022**

**APPROVING THE YOLO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION DISTRICT TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT  
AMENDED CLAIM FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2021-2022 FOR \$60,859**

**WHEREAS**, Yolo County Transportation District (YCTD) has submitted an amended claim for FY 20-21 State of Good Repair (SGR) funds for \$60,859 under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act for the amounts and purposes as follows:

**WHEREAS**, such a claim is consistent with State Law, with Guidelines adopted by the Board, and with approved apportionments for FY 2020-2021; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board Resolution No. 23-2021 on February 17, 2022, found there are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the Unincorporated Areas of the County of Yolo.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 5, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The Yolo County Transportation District’s proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy.
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the Yolo County Transportation District to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code.
3. The Yolo County Transportation District is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.
4. The sum of the Yolo County Transportation District’s allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area wide public transportation needs.
6. The Yolo County Transportation District has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The Yolo County Transportation District is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979, from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of

persons operating under a franchise or license.

8. The contractor, TransDev Inc., has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The Yolo County Transportation District is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board hereby approves the amended request FY 20-21 State of Good Repair for \$60,859 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the Yolo County Transportation District in proportion to funds received from the State.
