RESOLUTION NO. 47 – 2023

APPROVING THE COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO'S TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT CLAIM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 OF \$3,638,545

WHEREAS, the County of Sacramento has submitted FY 2022-2023 claim for Local Transportation Funds (LTF) of \$556,885 for Ped and Bike, \$100,375 for State of Good of Repair (SGR), and \$53,454 of SACOG Planning Fees and;

WHEREAS, the County has requested prior years' unclaimed funds as follows: LTF-FY 2018-2019 (\$197,913), FY 2019-2020 (\$762,288), FY 2021-2022 (\$129,427) including \$10,955 in SACOG's Planning fee; State Transit Assistance (STA) FY 2018-2019 (\$280,436) for a total of \$1,381,019 under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act. WHEREAS, such claim is consistent with State Law, with Guidelines adopted by the Board and with the approved apportionment for FY 2018-2019, FY 2020-2021, FY 2021-2022, and FY 2022-2023; and

WHEREAS, the Board Resolution No. 21-2022 on February 17, 2022, found that there are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the Unincorporated Areas of Sacramento County outside of the Sacramento Regional Transit District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 5, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The County of Sacramento's proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (MTP/SCS).

2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the County of Sacramento to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code when blended with other transit agencies in Sacramento County as allowed by AB432.

3. The County of Sacramento is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.

4. The sum of the County of Sacramento's allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from

the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.

5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area wide public transportation needs.

6. The County of Sacramento has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.

7. The County of Sacramento is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979 from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.

8. The County of Sacramento has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.

9. The County of Sacramento is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby approves a claim which includes Local Transportation Funds, State Transit Assistance and State of Good of Repair for a total claim of \$3,638,545 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the County of Sacramento in proportion to funds received from the State.
