**RESOLUTION NO. 56 – 2023**

**APPROVING THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO’S TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT CLAIM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$654,823**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Sacramento has submitted a claim for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-2023 Local Transportation Funds (LTF) for a total of \$654,823 under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act for the amounts and purposes as follows:
