### 1. Issue:

This item includes notes from the Civic Lab Year 2 June workshop. Civic Lab is a program that finds solutions to issues of regional importance through action at the local level.

### 2. Recommendation:

None; this item is for information only.

### 3. Background/Analysis:

Civic Lab is an accelerator program that designs and launches pilot projects to address challenges facing our region. Twelve project teams representing urban, suburban, and rural areas are participating in monthly intensive workshops aimed at developing implementable pilot projects.

Civic Lab Year 2 is focused on commercial corridor revitalization. While some commercial areas in the region are functioning well, many are not. Many have seen disinvestment, aging infrastructure, and vacant buildings. However, these areas are critical to the region's future economic success and quality of life. Civic Lab aims to make our commercial corridors vibrant places where people want to live, work, and play.

### 4. Discussion/Analysis:

This item provides a summary of the Civic Lab June workshop that took place on June 19. A summary of the June 19 workshop can be found in Attachment A. Teams are currently conducting peer site visits in lieu of a July workshop.
